CINCINNATI -- The paint is dry and the floors are polished; now Greater Cincinnati Behavioral Health Services, GCB would like to invite the community to an Open House on Wednesday, April 7 from 3:30 to 6:00 PM to celebrate its consolidation of services into one main location at 1501 Madison Road in East Walnut Hills.

GCB Executive Director Tony Dattilo is excited about inviting the public into the new home. "This has been a great move for GCB," he says. Until recently, GCB operated out of two locations: the upper floors of the Madison Road location and a building on McMillan Street. The acquisition of the entire Madison Road property has allowed GCB to expand its already diverse services, including psychiatric, housing, vocational and forensic, to include a health care clinic in conjunction with The HealthCare Connection. Studies show that on average, the mentally ill die 25 years earlier than the general population, usually due to untreated chronic medical conditions. The move allows GCB to provide better coordinated service to more clients while creating significant operational savings.

"I am so pleased to be working along side our great doctors, nurses, counselors, case workers and other staff," Dattilo says of the consolidation. "Our service will significantly improve with better coordination."

There will be a reception with light food and drinks, and tours of the building and its wide variety of services.
