

THE GREATER CINCINNATI FOUNDATION GIVES BIG BOOST TO CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

GCB is pleased to announce that it has received a \$60,000 grant from The Greater Cincinnati Foundation to fund our Capital Campaign. The grant will be used to fund the elevator upgrade project of the Capital Campaign, which was undertaken to consolidate services to a single location. GCB moved into the Madison Road facility last October in order to integrate primary and behavioral health care services for its clients all in one location. The new facility includes a primary health clinic and in-house pharmacy, in addition to GCB case managers, therapists, nurses, psychiatrists and administrative offices.
